

Anamarija Kurilić

Prof. Anamarija Kurilić was born in 1963 in Pula (Croatia), where she finished elementary and secondary schools. In 1989 she graduated in Archaeology and Italian language and literature at the Filozofski fakultet u Zadru (Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences in Zadar). In 1995 she finished Postgraduate study of archaeology at University of Ljubljana (Slovenia). In 2000 at the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences in Zadar she defended her doctoral thesis in ancient history.

In 1992 she started working at the Department of History of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences in Zadar where is currently holding the position of the associate professor. She is mainly teaching courses in ancient history, Latin epigraphy, and ancient social history. From 2003 to 2012 she was guest professor at Croatian Studies (Studia Croatica) - University of Zagreb (Croatia). Since 2001 she lectures at the Postgraduate study "Archaeology of the Eastern Adriatic" at the University of Zadar and since 2010 at the newly established Doctoral School in Humanities at the same University where she is also a vice-chair of the section "History". Furthermore, occasionally she has been a guest-lecturer at other doctoral studies in Croatia and abroad.

She is the leader of the scientific project "Elites of Roman Histria and Dalmatia" funded by the Ministry of Science, Education and Sport of Republic of Croatia.

She published several monographs and scholarly papers (<http://bib.irb.hr/lista-radova?autor=205516>). She actively participated in numerous scholarly colloquia and conferences. She also actively participated as lecturer in several seminars for teachers and in seminars organised by students and cultural associations. She participated in numerous archaeological excavations, and organised and led some of her own.

In 2012 she has been elected for the Head of the Ancient history section of the Croatian national committee for historical sciences (HNOPS). She was the vice-head of the Department of History at the University of Zadar (2005-2009), secretary general of the Round table of the International project "Digitalised atlas of the ancient Adriatic" (in Zadar 2001) and one of the editors of its proceedings. She is editor-in-chief of the scholarly journal "Miscellanea Hadriatica et Mediterranea" published by the Department of History (Univ. of Zadar).

She is member of several professional associations Adriaticum mare; Association Internationale d'Épigraphie Grecque et Latine; Croatian archaeological society; Croatian national committee for historical sciences). She is fluent in English and Italian, and basic user of some others (German, Spanish, French, ...) . She has good command of Microsoft Office™ tools (Word™, Excel™, PowerPoint™, Access™), of FileMaker Pro™ and of some graphic design applications (Adobe PhotoShop™).
