

Milorad Pavić

Associate Professor Milorad Pavić, PhD, was born on July 23, 1966 in Zadar. He completed primary school in Sukošan, attended secondary school in Zadar, and completed secondary school in Zagreb. He was a Croatian defender – an active participant in the war between 1991 and 1994.

In 1993 he enrolled in double-major study of Italian Language and Literature / History at the Faculty of Philosophy in Zadar, from which he graduated in June 1998. He became a research assistant in the research project *Povijest istočnojadranskog pomorstva* [*Maritime History of the Eastern Adriatic*] at the same Faculty in 1998. He successfully completed his postgraduate study of the history of Early Modern Period at the Faculty of Philosophy in Zagreb by defending his master's thesis entitled *Istočni Jadran u isolaru Giuseppe Rossacija* [*The Eastern Adriatic in Giuseppe Rossacio's Isolario*]. The same year he enrolled in doctoral study programme at the University of Zadar. In December 2006 he defended his doctoral thesis entitled *Istočni Jadran u talijanskim tiskanim geografskim priručnicima 16. i 17. stoljeća* [*The Eastern Adriatic in Italian Printed Geographical Manuals from the 16th and 17th Century*]. He was elected for scientific and academic position of an Assistant Professor in 2007, and became an Associate Professor in 2013.

He participates in undergraduate programme by holding compulsory courses of *World History in the Early Modern Period* and *History of Southeast Europe in Modern Period*. He also teaches elective graduate courses of *The Eastern Adriatic in Travel Literature of Early Modern Period*, *Navigation Skills – Navigating the Oceans in the 16th Century*, *Pilgrimages to the Holy Land in the Early Modern Period*, and *Economic History of Europe in the Early Modern Period*. He is also involved in the doctoral programme *Jadran – poveznica među kontinentima* [*The Adriatic Sea – a Link between Continents*], where he holds a course *Novovjekovna geografija istočnog Jadrana* [*Modern Geography of the Eastern Adriatic*].

His scientific interests include research of modern history of the Eastern Adriatic, especially geographical, cartographic and navigational manuals created before the end of the 18th century, maritime history and general history of Southeast Europe under the Ottoman rule.

Since 1998 he has been continuously involved in several national and international research projects. He is the author of university textbook *Povijest jugoistočne Europe pod osmanskom vlašću. Od pada Carigrada do Svištovskog mira* [*History of Southeast Europe under the Ottoman Rule. From the Fall of Constantinople to the Treaty of Svishtov*], and several other works in the field of historical geography, maritime history, historical demography and cartography. He participated in numerous national and international

conferences. At the moment, he is the President of Quality Assurance Committee at the Department of History, University of Zadar.
