## Sanda Uglešić

Sanda Uglešić was born June 30, 1966 in Zadar. She went to primary school in Petrčane and Zadar and finished her secondary education in Zadar in 1984. The same year she began to study history and art history and theory at the Faculty of Philosophy in Zadar, where she graduated in 1989.

She worked in *Bartol Kašić* and *Petar Preradović* primary schools in Zadar. In 1996 she passed her State license exam for a history teacher. During her years at the Petar Preradović Primary School, she was a mentor to several history students from the Zadar University for their *Metodika nastave povijesti* course.

In 2005 she became a lecturer of *Metodika nastave povijesti* course at the University of Zadar's Department of History. In 2006 she got a permanent position at the Department, where she teaches and holds seminars within the course *Metodika nastave povijesti* []. She teaches the same course at the Department of Teachers' and Preschool Teachers' Education to students with an enhanced history programme.

Ms Uglešić is also an associate in the Ministry of Science, Education and Sports' research project *Razvitak pomorstva i geografskih spoznaja na hrvatskom Jadranu* [Development of Maritime Affairs and Geographical Knowledge on Croatian Adriatic, T/N], with Mithad Kozličić, PhD, as principal investigator.

In the academic year 2004/05 she began her postgraduate studies at the University of Zadar. In December 2007 she defended her MA thesis entitled *Hrvatsko pučko školstvo od 1869. do 1941. u svjetlu pozitivnog zakonodavstva*. She defended her PhD thesis entitled *Obrazovanje pomoraca na hrvatskom dijelu Jadrana u svjetlu zakonske regulative 20. stoljeća* at the University of Zadar in July 2011.

In May 2011 she was elected a senior lecturer at the University of Zadar - Department of History. In 2012 she became an assistant professor at the same department. Her research activities are predominantly focused on Croatian education system in the  $19^{th}$  and  $20^{th}$  centuries. She is fluent in English and Italian.
